In 1945, I contracted in my home city of St. Louis, Missouri. However, the Lord blessed me with excellent medical care to the point that I never had to use any type of braces although polio affected both my left leg and arm. I moved to Huntsville, Alabama to work at Redstone Arsenal after graduating from the intern program for contract specialists in 1984. We then immediately established what we termed "State District Leaders" to help establish and maintain the ministry in each of the conference's five (5) states. Joseph and Bonita Scott were the first individuals we contacted and they accepted the call to lead the state of Tennessee. Both were just as excited about the ministry as we were! Needless to say, the experience of

working in this ministry along with these district leaders, whom I also consider my friends, has been a truly inspiring experience. We will always be involved in this ministry regardless of our formal position.
